SENATORS

CHARLES E. ALLEN (Republican). Thirtieth district. Born at Russell, Iowa, January 8, 1865. Scotch ancestry. Came to Nebraska in 1886. Attended Russell high school. Married Susan L. Morrow August 29, 1899; six children. Is a merchant. Is member of Protestant church and Masons including 32nd degree and Shrine. Address: Cozad.

CHARLES B. ANDERSON (Republican). Fourteenth district. Born at Albion, New York, June 30, 1865. Came to Nebraska in 1887. Ancestors were Scotch-Irish. Married Matilda M. Miller. Has six children. Received his education at Albion (N.Y.) schools. Is an officer of Bankers' Life Insurance Company of Lincoln. Has been a farmer, merchant and banker. Regent of University of Nebraska for seven years. Member of Lincoln school board. State senator in 1913 and 1921. Member of Congregational church; Masonic orders, Knights of Pythias, life member of Chamber of Commerce, Kiwanis Club, Knife and Fork Club and others. Address: Lincoln.

W. E. BANNING (Democrat). Second district. Member of senate in 1909-1911. Born at Wyoming, Nebraska in September, 1869. Ancestry English. Educated in district schools and graduate of Lincoln business college. Married Jennie E. Roush, September 6, 1899; one child. Is a farmer and horticulturist. Has been county commissioner. Member of M. W. A.; A. F. and A. M. Address: Union.

JOHN DAVID BARR (Republican). Sixteenth district. Member of legislature of 1919. Was born at Hanover, Illinois, in 1858. Ancestors Irish. Came to Nebraska in 1879. Attended the Pawnee academy. In 1890 he married Elizabeth M. Morrison; five children. Mr. Barr's present occupation is farming. He is a member of the Presbyterian church. Address: Liberty.

HENRY BEHRENS (Republican). Twelfth district. Representative in 1917, 1919 and 1921. Born on a farm in Benton county, Missouri, in 1864, of German parents. Educated in the public schools of Missouri. Came to Nebraska in 1886. Married Elizabeth Sila, and they have two children. Has been a farmer and vice-president of the First National Bank of Beemer. Member Lutheran church. Address: Beemer.

CLARENCE GEORGE BLISS (Republican). Twenty-fifth district. Senator in 1921. Born at Shelton, Nebraska, May 10, 1883. Ancestry English and Pennsylvania German. Mother came from England in 1870. Married Jessie Stebbins, January 6, 1912; three children. Public and high school education. Is president of City Bank of Elm Creek; also interested in farming and stockraising. County federal food administrator during the World War. Member of Methodist church, Elks, and Kearney Country Club. Address: Elm Creek.

WILLIAM NEWTON CHAMBERS (Republican). Fourth district. Member of legislature in 1915. Born at Omaha, Nebraska, July 21, 1879. Ancestry English-Scotch. Educated in Omaha public schools, high school, Smith's academy, St. Louis, graduated from the University of Michigan law school, 1902. Married Ruth Byrne; one daughter. Is a lawyer. Has been contractor. Member of Elks, Omaha Athletic Club, Omaha Field Club, Nebraska State Bar Association, Omaha Bar Association. Address: Omaha.

JOHN WILLIAM COOPER (Republican). Seventh district. Was born in Indiana in 1867. Graduated from the Rising Sun, Indiana, high school. Lived in Nebraska since 1892. Is a practicing attorney. Was state senator in 1919 and

1921. Is Protestant and a member of the following fraternal organizations: Masons, Knights of Pythias and Odd Fellows. Address: Omaha.

SOREN M. FRIES (Democrat). Twenty-fourth district. Representative in 1903, 1907, 1909, 1911, 1913, 1915, 1917, and 1919. Born in Denmark, September 27, 1861. Received his education in the common schools of Denmark. Came to Nebraska in 1879, locating on a farm in Howard county where he engaged in farming, stock raising and dairying. He has been road overseer and school director. Is a member of the Lutheran church and the following fraternal societies: Odd Fellows, Modern Woodmen, Ancient Order of United Workmen and the Danish Brotherhood. Address: Dannebrog.

JAMES W. GOOD (Republican). Thirty-second district. Was born in Kentucky, March 10, 1861. His ancestry is American. Received his early education in the country schools of Kentucky and Illinois and attended the business college at Macomb, Illinois. Came to Nebraska in 1884. Is married and the father of four children. Has been a farmer, rancher, merchant and real estate dealer. He was city councilman for two years. State senator in 1919 and 1921. Is a member of the Methodist church and the following fraternal organizations: Royal Neighbors, Woodmen and Ancient Order of United Workmen. Address: Chadron.

JOHN GUMB (Democrat). Eighth district. Born in Germany, June 29, 1860. Came to Nebraska in 1890. Educated in Chicago public schools, private school for engineering at Chicago, Hamstein Engineering school. Married Elizabeth Nuernberger, August 15, 1887; five children. Is a constructing and erecting engineer, manager of Fremont Beverage Company. Has been chairman of Board of Public Works at Fremont. Member of Protestant Episcopal church, Elks, Eagles, Woodmen of the World, United Commercial Travelers, T. P. A. Address: Fremont.

GEORGE BUCKLAND HASTINGS (Republican). Twenty-ninth district. Senator in 1921. Born at Denver, Colorado, July 2, 1892. Ancestry English. Married Dorothy Robertson, September 6, 1917; two children. Educated at Crete Academy, Oberlin College (A. B. 1913) and Harvard Law School, LL. B. 1916. Is a lawyer. Member Congregational church; Masons, Independent Order of Odd Fellows and Alpha Omega at Doane. Address: Grant.

WILLIAM HENRY ILLIAN (Republican). Twenty-first district. Senator in 1921. Born in Scott county, Iowa, June 30, 1858. Came to Nebraska, January 3, 1890. Married Adda Fox, October 6, 1897, who died January 23, 1898. Married Mrs. Elizabeth Geedom, September 26, 1916. His father was born in Waldeck, Germany, November 11, 1831, and came to America in 1851. Common school education. Has retired; was formerly a farmer, school teacher and banker. Has been postmaster at Humphrey, Nebraska, member of city council of Albion for eight years, mayor of Albion for two years. Member of Presbyterian church, Masonic orders, Knights of Pythias, Modern Woodmen and Royal Highlanders. Address: Albion.

ERICK JOHNSON (Republican). Twenty-sixth district. Representative in 1905, 1909, 1917, and senator in 1921. Born in Sweden, November 13, 1854. Received his education in the common schools of Sweden. Emigrated to Lincoln, Illinois, in 1873. In 1876 he made a trip to Nebraska and bought 160 acres of railroad land near Roseland and 1878 moved to this state and engaged in the business of farming and stock raising, from which he retired in 1914. He is president and director of the Roseland grain supply company, vice-president of the Roseland State Bank, and director in the Farm Central Mutual Insurance Company of Hastings. Was elected supervisor in Roseland township in 1891 and re-elected in 1893. Is a Lutheran. Address: Hastings.

JOHN S. KROH (Republican). Thirty-first district. Born at Clear Springs, Maryland, January 25, 1874. English-German ancestry. Came to Nebraska in 1913. Educated in the grade schools of Maryland and high school at Belle Plain, Iowa. Married Nellie E. Snyder, December 31, 1910; no children. Is an editor and publisher. Has been farmer, connected with mercantile firms in various capac-

ities, secretary of Keith County Community Club, vice-president and president of Nebraska Press Association, member of Congregational church, A. F. and A. M., Keith County Community Club. Address: Ogallala.

JOHN J. LARKIN (Republican). Third district. Born at Omaha, August 6, 1892. Educated at Creighton University and American Extension University. Married; two children. Is funeral director for Larkin Bros. Has been Secretary of Board of Public Welfare, Omaha. Address: Omaha.

J. C. MCGOWAN (Republican). Eleventh district. Senator in 1921. Born at Centralia, Missouri, February 19, 1869. Father came from Ireland in 1845. Married; one child. Common school education. Is a machinist; formerly a teacher. Member of Christian church; Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Sons of Veterans, Machinists union, Woodmen of the World, Ancient Order of United Workmen, and Benefit association of railway employees. Address: Norfolk.

CHARLES H. MEACHAM, JR., (Republican). Eighteenth district. Born at Phillipsburg, New Jersey, March 1, 1878, paternal ancestry was from New England, maternal of German descent. Came to Nebraska in 1879. Educated at Peru State Normal, Peru, Nebraska and the University of Nebraska. Married Eva Warren, March 30, 1904; one child. Is a merchant. Has been public school instructor; member of board of education at Dorchester, Nebraska. Member of the Methodist Episcopal church and Masonic Lodge. Address: Dorchester.

THOMAS C. OSBORNE (DEMOCRAT). Thirty-third district. Member of Nebraska constitutional convention 1919-20. Born at White Oak, Illinois, September 9, 1876. Ancestry Scotch-Irish. Came to Nebraska in 1887. Graduate from Hastings Academy, Hastings College, 1901; Omaha Seminary 1904. Married Julia M. Jones, December 21, 1903; five children. Minister and farmer. Member of Presbyterian church. Address: Bayard.

EMERSON R. PURCELL (Democrat). Twenty-third district. Representative in 1919. Born at Springfield, Illinois, 1866. Irish and English ancestry. Educated in public schools at Crete, Nebraska, and also attended Doane College. Married and has five children. Has been editor of the Custer County Chief at Broken Bow for twenty-seven years. Was mayor for two terms; member of board of education, and a member of board of managers State Board of Agriculture. Belongs to the Episcopal church, Masons (York and Scottish Rites, Shriners) and Odd Fellows. Address: Broken Bow.

PERRY A. C. REED (Republican). Nineteenth district. Representative in 1917 and senator in 1919 and 1921. Born on a farm near Monroe, Wisconsin, January 22, 1871. His paternal grandfather was a soldier in the Revolutionary War. Came to Nebraska in 1876. Received his education in the country schools of Nebraska. Married Abbie L. Wescott in 1896. Is a member of the Odd Fellows. Address: Henderson.

JOHN H. REIFENRATH (Democrat). Tenth district. Member of legislature in 1915 and 1917. Born at Wynot, Nebraska, in 1873. Ancestry German. Educated in common schools of Nebraska. Graduated from Creighton University, Omaha, 1904. Married Anna Nelly Casey in 1910, who died in 1918; four children. Remarried to Bertha Gerlach, 1921; one child. Is a banker. Has been farmer; now in the lumber and coal business. Member of Roman Catholic church and K. of C. Address: Crofton.

MURRAY F. RICKARD (Republican). Twenty-seventh district. Representative in 1917 and 1919, senator in 1921. Born September 26, 1881, at DeWitt, Nebraska. Attended Guide Rock high school, Franklin academy, and University of Nebraska. He is a farmer; formerly taught school. Is a Methodist. Has membership in the Modern Woodmen of America. Address: Guide Rock.

JOHN W. ROBBINS (Republican). Sixth district. Senator in 1921. Was born in Jefferson county, Indiana. Came to Omaha, Nebraska, in 1885, after graduating from Hanover College, at Hanover, Indiana, in 1884. Married Isabel

Wyman in 1894 and has four children. Is a realtor and has a general insurance agency. Is a member of the Congregational church, and the following organizations: Masons, Beta Theta Pi (college fraternity), Omaha Real Estate Board (president 1907-1909), Omaha Chamber of Commerce, Happy Hollow Club. Address: Omaha.

CHARLES L. SAUNDERS (Republican). Fifth district. Born in Mount Pleasant, Iowa, in 1857. Educated at Cornell university and Columbia college law school. Came to Omaha in 1861, when his father was appointed governor of Nebraska territory by President Lincoln. Is in the real estate business in Omaha and is president of the Omaha Real Estate Company and of the Saunders Investment Company. Was supervisor of census for the second congressional district for 1910. Was a member of the state senate in the sessions of 1903, 1905, 1907, 1913, 1915, 1919, and 1921. Member of constitutional convention, 1919-20. During the 1907 session he was president pro tem acting as governor during the absence of Governor Sheldon and Lieutenant-Governor Hopewell. Is a member of the leading clubs of Omaha and of many fraternal orders, including the Masons and Elks. Address: Omaha.

HARRY BROOKS SHELLENBARGER (Democrat). Twenty-eighth district. Was born in Warren county, Illinois, December 27, 1874. German-Scotch-English ancestry. Came to Nebraska 1883. Educated at Stella, Nebraska, high school. Married Myra Shranter April 9, 1905. They have one child. Farmer and live stock raiser. Is a Protestant and a member of A. F. A. M. Address: Stamford.

CHARLES SMRHA (Democrat). Seventeenth district. Born at Styria, Europe, September 14, 1876. Czechoslovakian ancestry. Came to Nebraska in 1884. Educated at Exeter, Nebraska high school, Western normal and Lincoln normal at Lincoln, Nebraska. Married Agnes Barta, August 30, 1904; four children. Is a banker. Has been school teacher, county superintendent of schools, Fillmore county, and member of South Platte exemption board during late war. Is member of S. A. W. V., A. F. and A. M., I. O. O. F., K. of P., A. O. U. W., Z. C. B. A. Address: Milligan.

BRANTLEY E. STURDEVANT (Republican). Twenty-second district. Representative in 1919 and 1921. Born in Wyoming county, Pennsylvania, in 1852. Ancestors were mixed, English, Irish, Scotch and Dutch. Came to Nebraska in 1871. Married in 1876 and has three children. His present occupation is selling real estate and insurance, but his past included station agent, merchant, register of the United States land office at O'Neill. Is a Baptist, Modern Woodman, Royal Highlander and a Royal Neighbor. Address: Atkinson.

CHARLES J. THIELEN (Democrat). Twentieth district. Member of Constitutional Convention, 1919-20. Born September 6, 1882, near Earling, Iowa. Came to Nebraska in 1902. Attended country schools and normal schools at Woodbine, Iowa. Creighton University 1902-1909; Ann Arbor 1909-1910; Creighton University 1910-1911. Is a lawyer and educator. Married Ava Shober, July 23, 1912; has two children. Is member of Catholic church; K. of C., C. O. F. Address: Humphrey.

PHILLIP A. TOMEK (Democrat). Thirteenth district. Born in Saunders county, Nebraska, May 1, 1887. Educated in high school and Fremont college. Married Margaret C. Green in 1909; three sons. Is a lawyer. Member of Catholic church, Elks and Knights of Columbus. Address: David City.

CHARLES JOSEPH WARNER (Republican). Fifteenth district. Representative in 1901, 1903, 1905 and state senator in 1919 and 1921. Born in Lancaster county, Nebraska, 1875, of Swedish ancestry. Attended Lutheran academy in 1891-1892, Lincoln normal university, 1894, and graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1899, and from the Columbian Law School, Washington, D. C., 1902. Mr. Warner is a progressive farmer and president of the Lancaster Farmers' State Bank. Is a member of the Congregational church; Masons (Scottish Rite, Knights Templar), and Modern Woodmen. Address: Waverly.

GEORGE WILKINS (Republican). Ninth district. Born at Homer, Nebraska, June 23, 1883. German ancestry. Educated in country schools from 1890-99. Married Cora E. Sinclair, September 11, 1912, who died 1923; one daughter. Is public accountant. Has been deputy county treasurer, clerk of the district court and county clerk of Dakota county, member of local draft board for Dakota county and deputy collector of internal revenue. Member of Lutheran church, Masons (Scottish Rite K. C. C. H.) and Mystic Shrine. Address: Emerson.

JOHN WILTSE (Republican). First district. Born January 2, 1876, near Falls City, Nebraska. Ancestors from Holland and Germany. Attended the country school and the high school at Falls City, and taught in the public schools of Richardson county for ten years. Was admitted to the practice of law in June, 1904, and has practiced continuously since. Was twice elected city clerk and twice mayor, also twice county judge. Member of constitutional convention, 1919-20, and senator in 1921. Belongs to the Methodist Episcopal church. Has membership in the Odd Fellows. Has large agricultural interests and devotes some time to their supervision. Address: Falls City.

JAMES ALLAN (Republican). Eighth district. Member of Nebraska legislature in 1895, 1919. Born in Scotland in 1855 and lived in Nebraska since 1871. Received his education in the public schools of Scotland and West Point, Nebraska. Was sidewalk inspector of Omaha for six years, deputy United States marshal for ten years, deputy sheriff for two years, city councilman of Omaha two years, and was principal of the Allan detective agency. ROSS AMSPOKER (Republican). Seventy-eighth district. Born in Iowa in 1874. Came to Nebraska in 1882. Ancestry Dutch and Scotch. Attended University of Nebraska, 1903. Married Getha McKee, November 14, 1906; two children. Is an attorney. Also has extensive farm interests in northern Nebraska. Has held county offices in Keya Paha county for ten years. JAMES AUTEN (Democrat). Sixty-first district. Member of Nebraska legislature in 1917. Born at Valparaiso, Indiana, April 24, 1861, and came to Nebraska in 1879. Educated in public schools. Married Belle Penny. Two children. Is a farmer. Mr. Auten attends Christian church. Is a member of Masonic lodge, Knights of Pythias and Modern Woodmen. Address: Albion.

EDWARD EVERETTE AUXIER (Democrat). First district. Born in Johnson county, Kentucky, 1864. Ancestry French and Dutch. Came to Nebraska in 1885. Educated in common, private and subscription schools. Married Lucy Prichard in 1887. Four children living, two deceased. Is farmer. Has been school teacher. Connected with bank. Member of county board of Richardson county from 1898 to 1902. Member of I. O. O. F. Address: Dawson.

THOMAS AXTELL (Progressive). Eighty-ninth district. Born in Jefferson county, Nebraska, April 7, 1876. Welsh and Scotch-Irish ancestry. Educated in public schools. Married Mary Harris, June 21, 1906. One child. Is locomotive engineer; formerly farmer. Member of Locomotive Engineers, Division No. 88. Address: North Platte.

E. PRESTON BAILEY (Republican). Fifty-fifth district. Born at Carleton, Nebraska, November 11, 1886. American ancestry. Attended school at Independent school, Northwestern Business College, University of Nebraska, American School of Civil Engineers. Married Winifred A. Roberts, July 15, 1919; two children. Is a farmer. Has been farmer and stockman, engineer, merchant, prospector, cowboy and secret service man. Held position of road overseer, assessor, member of council of defense, member of school board, member of election board, member of U. S. Reserves for three years, lieutenant Home Guards. Is member

of the Brethren church, P. M. in A. F. and A. M., Modern Woodmen of America. Address: Carleton.

H. MALCOLM BALDRIDGE (Republican). Eighteenth district. Born of Scottish ancestry. Came to Nebraska in 1894. Attended Omaha high school, Andover, Yale, Nebraska Law, LL. B. in 1921. Wild, February 28, 1900. Four children. Farmer. Member of Methodist church, Modern Woodmen, Farmers' Union of Crete. Address: Crete.

W. M. BARBOUR (Republican). Ninety-seventh district. Born in Fulton county, Illinois, in 1860. Came to Nebraska in 1865, lived in Nebraska City and Lincoln until 1870, and then on a farm in Cass county until 1887. Took a homestead in Scotts Bluff county and still resides there. Has been actively identified with irrigation development since the beginning of irrigation construction in his county. Has been president of the board of directors of Enterprise ditch, chairman of Nebraska Irrigation Association, and chairman of the Associated Irrigators for six years.
