LEGISLATURE OF 1929-1930

SENATORS

ROSS AMSPOKER (Republican). Twenty-second district. Member of house of representatives in 1923; senator in 1927 and 1929. Born in Iowa, 1874. Came to Boone county, Nebraska, in 1882. Married November 14, 1906 to Getha McKee; two children. Ancestors came from Holland and Scotland before the Revolutionary war. Graduated from University of Nebraska law school in 1903. Is a lawyer and interested in banking institutions. Was county treasurer from 1903 to 1908 and county attorney for six years. Address: Springview.

W. B. BANNING (Democrat). Second district. Member of senate in 1909, 1911, 1923, 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born at Wyoming, Nebraska in September, 1869. Ancestry English. Educated in district schools and graduate of Lincoln business college. Married Jennie E. Roush, September 6, 1899; one child. Is a farmer and horticulturist. Has been county commissioner. Member M. W. A.; A. F. and A. M. Address: Union.

JOHN EDWARD BOWMAN (Republican). Twenty-fifth district. Born at Streator, Illinois, September 15, 1878. Mother a native of United States; father came from England in 1873. Parents moved to Nebraska in 1879. Married January 16, 1907 to Carrie Luella Keef. Attended York county schools and graduated from the medical department of Cotner university, 1912. Is a physician and farmer. Has been mayor, county physician and state senator in 1929. Belongs to Presbyterian church, Masonic lodge, Scottish Rite, Shrine, Knights of Pythias, Odd Fellows and Rotary club.. Address: Loup City.

RUDOLPH BRAZDA (Democrat). Twelfth district. Born in Cuming county, Nebraska, April 17, 1874. Parents emigrated from Bohemia in October, 1866 and came directly to Nebraska. Public school education. Is in real estate and loans business. Has been merchant and druggist. Held office of county clerk, secretary of draft board during World War and charter member of community club. State senator in 1929. Is a Catholic. Belongs to Knights of Columbus. Has been member of the band for forty-three years. Address: West Point.

OLIVER G. CLARK (Republican). Twentieth district. Born in Unionville, Missouri. Came to Nebraska in 1911. Married April 26, 1908 to Mabelle S. Sanford; two sons. Graduate of Palmer chiropractic college at Davenport, Iowa. Is a chiropractor. Was president of Platte valley chiropractic association, 1916, chairman of legislative committee of State chiropractic association, 1918-1923, and president of Nebraska chiropractic association, 1925-1926. State senator in 1929. Address: Columbus.

JOHN WILLIAM COOPER (Republican). Seventh district. Was born in Indiana in 1867. Graduated from the Rising Sun, Indiana, high school. Lived in Nebraska since 1892. Is a practicing attorney. Was state senator in 1919, 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927 and 1929; president pro tem in 1929. Member and secretary of Nebraska-Iowa boundary commission. Is Protestant and member of the following fraternal organizations: Masons, 33rd degree, Knights of Pythias and Odd Fellows. Address: Omaha.

GUS A. DWORAK (Democrat). Third district. Born in Omaha, August 20, 1895. Parents came from Bohemia in 1887. Graduate of public schools and Boyles college. Married April 25, 1917 to Marie Anna Vak; four children. Is a book keeper and stenographer. Was agent for Travelers' insurance company for eight years and bookkeeper for Western electric company for four years. Served as secretary for a city commissioner of Omaha. State senator in 1929. Is a Roman Catholic. Address: Omaha.

HARRY K. EASTON (Democrat). Fourth district. Born in Belleville, Kansas. Came to Nebraska in 1890. Married Anna Myrtle Rasp, September 29, 1928. Ancestors were Irish, Scotch and French. Attended grammar and high schools and Creighton university. Has been a merchant; is now a finance broker. Is a veteran

of World war. Chairman of Nebraska Democratic club. Belongs to Episcopal church and American Legion. Address: Omaha.

GEORGE F. FRUSH (Democrat). Thirteenth district. Born at Pleasantville, Iowa, in 1861. Came to Nebraska in 1882. Married September 6, 1885 to May E. Evans; two children. Ancestors came from Ohio. Attended high school at Knoxville, Iowa, and Professor McKee's academy. Took courses in bookkeeping and accounting. Was formerly a farmer and shipped live stock. Is now secretary and manager of Wahoo mutual loan and building association. Was a member of city council for four years, city treasurer three years, county treasurer four years, county assessor four years, chairman of board of equalization four years and state senator in 1927 and 1929. Is a Presbyterian. Belongs to I. O. O. F. lodge and Rebekah lodge, and Modern Woodmen. Address: Wahoo.

DWIGHT PALMER GRISWOLD (Republican). Thirty-second district. Was born at Harrison, Nebraska, November 27, 1893. His ancestors came to America from England before the Revolutionary war. Educated in Gordon high school, Kearney military academy, Nebraska Wesleyan university, and the University of Nebraska, being graduated there in 1914. Served two years in the army, and received his discharge as a captain in the field artillery. Was married Sept. 25, 1919 to Erma Elliott; one son and one daughter. Was formerly a bank cashier. Is now editor of the Gordon Journal. He was a member of the house of representatives in 1921 and of the senate in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Is a member of the Presbyterian church, of the Masons, Kiwanis Club, American Legion and Alpha Tau Omega (college fraternity). Address: Gordon.

CLARK JEARY (Republican). Fourteenth district. Born in Lincoln, Nebraska, April 25, 1892. His father was born in England; his mother in America. Educated in the Lincoln public schools, the University of Nebraska and the University of Michigan. Married in July, 1914, to Marie Minor; has one daughter. He is a lawyer. Was state representative in 1919 and 1921 and senator in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Attends the Christian church. He is a member of the Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite Masons, Shriners and Knights of Pythias. Address: Lincoln.

CHARLES WILLIAM JOHNSON (Republican). Thirty-first district. State senator in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born in Sweden, February 21, 1864. Came to America with his parents in 1868. Settled in Nebraska in 1886. Attended Swedish school and public and high schools. Was married April 21, 1885 to Ellen C. Nelson. Has nine children. Is a farmer, rancher, merchant and banker. Has served on the school board for thirty years, on the town board for ten years and as postmaster fourteen years. Has been county assessor. He affiliates with the Methodist church. Is a member of the Masons Consistory 32° and Shrine, W. O. W., A. O. U. W., Odd Fellows, and Eastern Star. Address: Potter.

JOHN HARRY JOHNSON (Republican). Twenty-eighth district. Representative in 1919, 1921 and senator in 1929. Born on a farm in Indiana, 1875, but came to Nebraska when only three years old. Lived on a farm, attended country schools and went to farming for himself at an early age. Member of constitutional convention, 1919-1920. Married in 1901; eleven children. Deceased.

GEORGE C. JUNKIN (Republican). Twenty-eighth district. Born June 9, 1858 in Jefferson county, Iowa. Ancestry Scotch-Irish. Married in 1885 to Emma M. Swinburne; three children. Attended high school at Red Oak, Iowa, 1870-1874. Is a farmer and stockraiser. Was member of house of representatives in 1903 and 1905 and of senate in 1930, secretary of state, 1907 to 1911, member of constitutional convention, 1919-1920, and delegate to Republican national convention, 1924. Address: Smithfield.

HORACE F. KENNEDY (Republican). Twenty-third district. Born at Brownville, Nebraska, September 2, 1873. Married, December 25, 1900 to Nannie R. Talbot; two children. Attended Brownville school, Custer county country school, Broken Bow schools and Omaha business college. Has been a farmer and proprietor of hotels; is now owner and manager of a theatre. Was sheriff of Custer county, 1908-1912, delegate to Republican national convention, 1920, has been chairman of Republican

county central committee for the past ten years, and state senator in 1929. Is a Spanish-American war veteran. Was lieutenant of M company. First Nebraska U. S. V., serving in Philippines, 1898-1899. Captain of Nebraska national guard company, 1901-1905. Is a member of Baptist church, Masons, Scottish Rite, Knights Templar, Mystic Shrine, Broken Bow public service club, and Rotary club. Address: Broken Bow.

RALPH MALLORY KRYGER (Republican). Twenty-first district. Born at Neligh, Nebraska, December 29, 1889. Married December 21, 1915, to Catharine Seymour Huffman; three children. Ancestors came from Holland, Scotland and Ireland about 1800. Graduated from Neligh high school in 1907 and from the law college of the University of Nebraska, 1913. Is a practicing attorney. Has been city councilman of Neligh, county attorney of Antelope county for eight years, member of school board and state senator in 1927 and 1929. Is an Episcopalian. Belongs to Masons, Rotary club and Delta Chi. Address: Neligh.

ELMER W. McFARLAND (Republican). Seventeenth district. Born at McLean, Illinois, October 5, 1861. Came to Nebraska in 1883. Maternal ancestors came from England in 1638 and paternal ancestors emigrated from Scotland about 1800. Married December 24, 1882 to Olive J. Place; five children. Attended high school at Rantoul, Illinois. Is a general merchant. Was a city official for six years, member of school board for fifteen years and state senator in 1929. Belongs to Methodist church and Masons. Address: Ohiova.

J. C. McGOWAN (Republican). Eleventh district. Senator in 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born at Centralia, Missouri, February 19, 1869. Father came from Ireland in 1845. Married; one child. Common school education. Is a machinist; formerly a teacher. Member of Christian church; Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Sons of Veterans, Machinists' union, Woodmen of the World, Ancient Order of United Workmen, and Benefit association of railway employees. Address: Norfolk.

ARTHUR L. NEUMANN (Democrat). Ninth district. Born at Andover, Illinois, February 3, 1870. Came to Nebraska in 1881. Unmarried. Father came from Germany in 1857 and mother from Sweden in 1849. Attended Oakland, Nebraska, schools. Has been a banker since 1892; was formerly a clerk. State senator in 1927 and 1929. Belongs to Masons, Elks and Odd Fellows. Address: Oakland.

JAMES A. PATTON (Republican). Eighth district. State senator in 1929. Born at Jackson, Ohio, October 7, 1854. Came to Nebraska in 1884. Married on April 13, 1876 to Miss Lee; four children. Ancestors were Irish. Has a common school education and also attended Valparaiso College (Indiana) for two years. Is a farmer, banker and stockman. Has been clerk of the district court and member of school board of city of Ord. Was chairman of the school board for several years. Address: Fremont.

WILLIAM LESLIE RANDALL (Republican). Fifth district. Born in Omaha, May 14, 1889. Is of Scottish ancestry. Married December 29, 1917 to Florence B. Hill; three children. Graduated from Omaha high school and holds degree of LL.B., 1913, from college of law, University of Nebraska. Is a lawyer. Member of Nebraska house of representatives, 1921 and state senate, 1929. Belongs to Presbyterian church, Sigma Nu, Elks and Lions' club. Address: Omaha.

PERRY A. C. REED (Republican). Nineteenth district. Representative in 1917 and senator in 1919, 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927 and 1929. Born on a farm near Monroe, Wisconsin, January 22, 1871. His paternal grandfather was a soldier in the Revolutionary war. Came to Nebraska in 1876. Received his education in the country schools of Nebraska. Married Abbie L. Westcott in 1896. Is a member of the Odd Fellows. Address: Henderson.

MURRAY F. RICKARD (Republican). Twenty-seventh district. Representative in 1917 and 1919; senator in 1921, 1923, and 1929. Born September 26, 1881, at DeWitt, Nebraska. Attended Guide Rock high school, Franklin academy and University of Nebraska. He is a farmer. Formerly taught school. Belongs to Methodist church and M. W. A. Address: Guide Rock.

JAMES A. RODMAN (Republican). Sixth district. Born May 6, 1887 at Salem, Indiana. Ancestors came to America in early eighteenth century from England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. Came to Nebraska in 1888. Graduated from Blair, Nebraska, high school and the University of Nebraska. Married August 15, 1914 to Helen I. Lawrence of Fremont. Has four sons. Taught school, practiced law, and is at present a life insurance executive. Was county attorney of Kimball county, 1915-1919, and county attorney of Banner county, 1917-1919. Served in House of representatives from Kimball county in 1919 and 1921. Member of Constitutional convention in 1920. Representative from the eighth district in 1925 and from the eighteenth district in 1927. First representative to have served the state from three different districts. Speaker of the House of representatives in 1927, the only speaker elected from Omaha since Nebraska has been a state. State senator in 1929. Member of Methodist church, Masons, and Delta Upsilon fraternity. Address: Omaha.

HENRY F. SCHEPMAN (Democrat). First district. Was born in a log cabin at Lockwood, Dade county, Missouri, September 26, 1898. German parentage. Lived near Shenandoah, Iowa. Moved to Nebraska in 1907. Graduate of Tecumseh high school and arts and science college and law college of University of Nebraska. Has attended the University of Chicago. Formerly was a farmer; is now a lawyer. State representative from Johnson county in 1925 and state senator in 1929; secretary to Congressman John H. Morehead during the 69th congress. Is an ex-service man. Married December 6, 1928 to Sherlie Whitaker. Member of Dramatic club of University of Nebraska, American Legion, and Delta Theta Phi (college fraternity). Attends Lutheran church. Address: Falls City.

PERLEE W. SCOTT (Republican). Twenty-ninth district. Was born in Kirksville, Iowa, July 24, 1860. His ancestors emigrated from Ireland to America in 1800. Educated in the Iowa public schools and Parsons college at Fairfield, Iowa. Settled in Nebraska in 1885. Married Jessie Ware, November 6, 1892. Has three children. He is a lawyer. Has been a member of the school board and the Imperial town board. He was county attorney of Chase county for twenty years, a member of the constitutional convention of 1919-20, and of the state senate in 1927 and 1929. Attends the Methodist church. Is a Mason and an Odd Fellow. Address: McCook.

ALLEN S. STINSON (Democrat). Tenth district. Born at Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Came to Nebraska in 1879. Married in 1901; five children. Mrs. Stinson's maiden name was Ulrich. Paternal ancestry is Scotch-Irish and maternal, Dutch. Both branches of the family came to America before the Revolution. Attended Creighton high school, and Fremont normal college. Has been county superintendent, deputy county clerk, president of commercial club and merchant. State senator in 1927 and 1929. Is a Mason. Address, Niobrara.

RALPH R. VANCE (Republican). Twenty-sixth district. Born at Ripley, Ohio, in 1869. His ancestors were Scotch and Irish. He settled in Nebraska in 1887. Was educated in the common schools. He married Anna V. Frisch, March 12, 1905. They have two children. Has engaged in farming, milling, grain buying and banking. He attends the Presbyterian church. Was a state representative in 1919, 1921, 1923, and senator in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Has been vice-president of the State bank of Hastings for ten years, vice-president of the Hastings milling company for eight years, secretary of the Farmers' grain and supply company for fifteen years, director of the Hastings mutual fire insurance company for fourteen years and township treasurer for three years. Address: Hastings.

CHARLES JOSEPH WARNER (Republican). Fifteenth district. Representative in 1901, 1903, 1905 and state senator in 1919, 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927, and 1929. Born in Lancaster county, Nebraska, 1875, of Swedish ancestry. Attended Lutheran academy in 1891-1892, Lincoln normal university, 1894, and graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1899, and from the Columbian law school, Washington, D. C., 1902. Mr. Warner is a progressive farmer and president of the Lancaster farmers' state bank. Is a member of the Congregational church; Masons (Scottish Rite, Knights Templar), and Modern Woodmen. Address: Waverly.

ANDY J. WELCH (Democrat). Eighteenth district. Born at Milford, Nebraska, in 1875. Married January 1, 1896 to Mary Birky; two children. Attended public school. Is a merchant and farmer. Served four terms on village board and six terms on school board. State senator in 1929. Belongs to Methodist church and M. W. A. Address: Milford.

HERMANN GODFREY WELLENSIEK (Republican). Twenty-fourth district. Born on September 28, 1884 at Syracuse, Nebraska. Married September 12, 1925 to Anna Blanche Swartwood; one son. Ancestors came from Germany. Attended Syracuse high school and college of law, University of Nebraska. Has been a farmer and banker; is now a lawyer. Served as city attorney of Grand Island and Harvard and state senator in 1929. Belongs to Evangelical Synod of North America, A. F. & A. M., Elks, and Riverside golf club. Address: Grand Island.

KENNETH SPICER WHERRY (Republican). Sixteenth district. Born at Liberty, Nebraska, February 28, 1892. Married in 1920 to Margery Cowell; two children. Ancestors emigrated from Wales in 1790 and settled in Pennsylvania. Attended Pawnee high school, University of Nebraska and Harvard University. Is a merchant. Has been a member of the town council and mayor of Pawnee City and member of state senate in 1929. Is a Presbyterian. Address: Pawnee City.

WESLEY T. WILCOX (Republican). Thirteenth district. Born in Trumbull county, Ohio. Came to Nebraska in 1886. Married in 1886 to Minnie A. Dabney; four children. Ancestors came from England in 1835. Attended Western Reserve seminary, Grand River institute, and University of Iowa. Was a lawyer for forty years; is now retired. Has been city and county attorney at North Platte, member of Nebraska house of representatives in 1889 and state senator in 1927 and 1929. Is a Methodist. Belongs to K. of P., Masons, Knights Templar, Shrine, and Scottish Rite. Owns and manages farms and ranches. Address: North Platte.

ASA B. WOOD (Republican). Thirty-third district. Born in Wapello county, Iowa, August 26, 1865, of Scotch and English ancestry. High school education. Came to Nebraska in 1886, and to North Platte valley in 1887, establishing the Gering Courier which he still conducts, and is also president of the Scottsbluff Star-Herald (daily) publishing company. Married at Cozad, Nebraska, on October 11, 1888, to Maggie Claypool. Has four children. Has farm and stock raising interests and was postmaster at Gering fifteen years, but held no other office until elected to senate of 1925; also member of senate in 1927 and 1929. Interested in irrigation, and was president of Nebraska irrigation association in 1924. Has been president of Nebraska press association and president of Gering commercial club. Member of Christian church, A. F. & A. M., York and Scottish Rite Masonry, I. O. O. F., Elks, Shrine. Address: Gering.

MAXWELL W. ADAMS (Democrat). Sixty-sixth district. Member of Nebraska house of representatives in 1925, 1927 and 1929. Was born at Plattsmouth, Nebr., July 11, 1888. Is a graduate of the Plattsmouth high school and the normal department of York college. Was married June 5, 1910, to Ethel F. Downing; has three children. Has been a school teacher. Is now a farmer and stock raiser. Member Methodist church, I. O. O. F. and the A. F. and A. M. Address: Dannebrog.

ARTHUR E. ALLYN (Republican). Sixty-ninth district. Born February 17, 1857. Came to Nebraska in 1882. Married October 30, 1884 to Ida M. Moore; two children, both deceased. Ancestors came to America in colonial times. Graduate of Pennsylvania state normal school. Has been a teacher, county superintendent, and member of the city council, board of control and legislature of 1929. Was a coal and grain dealer; is now retired. Belongs to Congregational church and Knights of Pythias. Address: Hastings.

JOHN A. AMSBERRY (Republican). Seventy-ninth district. Born at Point Pleasant, West Virginia. Came to Nebraska in 1878. Married September 24, 1879 to Mary Buckley; three children. Ancestors were English. Attended common school. Is a farmer and stockraiser. Has been school director of city school in

Mason City. Member of state legislature in 1929. Is a Baptist. Belongs to Farmers' national congress. Address: Mason City.

VERNON D. ANDREWS (Republican). Thirty-second district. Born at Van Wert, Iowa, July 25, 1890. Came to Nebraska in 1907. Married on October 17, 1911 to Luella Dierks; four children. Ancestors in United States for many generations. Attended Lincoln high school, University of Nebraska and Nebraska school of business. Was formerly a teacher, athletic coach and salesman; is now a farmer, banker and sportsman. Member of Nebraska legislature 1929. Is past president of Lincoln cosmopolitan club, past president of International cosmopolitan club, member of board of trustees of Sigma Phi Epsilon, president of Nebraska jersey breeders' association, member of board of Nebraska dairymen's association and of Southwestern jersey breeders' association.
