





LEGISLATURE OF 1933-1934

SENATORS

CRIST ANDERSEN (Democrat). Twenty-second district. Representative in 1913, 1915, and 1917; Senator in 1931 and 1933. Born at Cedar Falls, Iowa, September 10, 1867, and came to Nebraska in 1880. Both his parents came from Denmark. His education was obtained in the public schools of Iowa and Nebraska. He is a farmer. Was county supervisor of Boyd county for six years and has held the office of precinct assessor. Attends the Methodist church. He is an Odd Fellow and a member of the Ancient Order of United Workmen. Address: Bristow.

VICTOR ANDERSON (Democrat). Nineteenth district. Born in Sarta Sandviken, Sweden, March 22, 1865. Settled in Nebraska, August 28, 1884. December 25, 1888, married Emma Wilson who died January 24, 1903; four children. Married Charlotte Samuelson, June 22, 1904; four children. Ancestors migrated from Sweden to America in 1884. Attended high school in Sweden and Barnes school of embalming in Chicago. Farmed up till 1903; since then has been engaged in the furniture and undertaking business. Served as mayor of Stromsburg, president of board of education, president of chamber of commerce, president of hotel company, regent of Bethel Academy, St. Paul, Minnesota, president and treasurer of Nebraska state Baptist conference and vice-chairman of the First Baptist church. Served as state senator in 1933. Is a Baptist. Address: Stromsburg.

W. B. BANNING (Democrat). Second district. Member of Senate in 1909, 1911, 1923, 1925, 1927, 1929, and 1933. Born in Wyoming, Nebraska, September, 1869. Ancestry, English. Educated in district schools and graduate of Lincoln business college. Married Jennie E. Roush, September 6, 1899; one child. Is a farmer and horticulturist. Has been county commissioner. Member of M. W. A., A. F. & A. M. Address: Union.

JOHN G. BOELTS (Democrat). Fifty-ninth district. Representative in 1909, and 1931, and senator in 1933. Is a farmer. Address: Central City.

JOSEPH BREN (Democrat). Fourth district. Born in Bohemia, June 24, 1883. Came to Nebraska in 1891. Married Frances Reynek, March 26, 1913; two children. Attended public schools and Omaha business college. Farmed and ranched in Montana from 1909 to 1922. At present is employed by the Union Pacific. Served on school board in Montana. Is serving as a trustee of W. O. W. Affiliated with the Catholic church. Served as a senator in 1933. Address: Omaha.

EMIL E. BRODECKY (Democrat). Twelfth district. Born in Schuyler, Nebraska, June 26, 1885. Married October 14, 1908, to Lucy M. Novak; three boys. Father came in 1873 and mother in 1871 from Czechoslovakia. Was graduated from Howells high school in 1904 and the University school of agriculture in 1907. Is engaged in farming and dairying. Served as a member of state militia for three years, on the board of education three terms, and as secretary-treasurer of Farmers' lumber and grain company at Howells for seventeen years. Member of Z. C. B. J. and of Howells band. Was a state senator in 1933. Is a member of St. John's church. Address: Howells.

JAMES ALBERT BRUNT (Democrat). Seventeenth district. Born May 23, 1883, near Eddyville, Iowa. Came to Nebraska in 1914. Married Miss Powell, August 26, 1908; one child. Ancestors have lived in America since before the Revolutionary war. Attended Peru college. Is a practicing attorney, having been admitted to the bar in 1906. Worked as title examiner. Is a member of the Christian church. Was a senator in 1933. Address: Fairbury.

WILLIAM C. BULLARD (Democrat). Twenty-ninth district. Born in Omaha, May 28, 1899. Married Edith Bacon, December 31, 1919; two boys. Attended high school and grades in Omaha. Formerly was engaged in the wholesale plumbing and heating business in Omaha. Now is a lumber dealer. Is president of McCook Chamber of Commerce. Belongs to Episcopal church and B. P. O. E. Was a member of the senate in 1933. Address: McCook.

JOHN S. CALLAN (Democrat). Sixteenth district. Was born in Odell, Nebraska, April 20, 1890. Married Agnes Armstrong, June 18, 1919; two boys. Ancestors came from Scotland and Germany. Was graduated from Odell high school. Was postmaster at Odell for nine years. Present occupation—hardware, implement and automobile dealer. Has been treasurer of a district school, a member of the city council, and a state senator in 1933. Served over-seas thirteen months. Is a Mason and a member of the American legion. Address: Odell.

GUS A. DWORAK (Democrat). Third district. Born in Omaha, August 20, 1895. Parents came from Bohemia in 1887. Graduate of public school and Boyles college. Married April 25, 1917, to Marie Anna Vak; four children. Is a bookkeeper and stenographer. Was agent for Travelers' insurance company for eight years and bookkeeper for Western electric company for four years. Served as secretary for a city commissioner of Omaha. Is a member of the Catholic Sokol, Brown Park improvement club, Southeast political club, Mandan Park improvement club, Southeast progressive improvement club and St. Wenceslaus Catholic church. Is vice-president of Castellar improvement club and committeeman of troop 26, Omaha Boy Scouts. State senator in 1929, 1931 and 1933. Address: Omaha.

GEORGE F. FRUSH (Democrat). Thirteenth district. Born at Pleasantville, Iowa, in 1861. Came to Nebraska in 1882. Married September 6, 1885, to May E. Evans; two children. Ancestors came from Ohio. Attended high school at Knoxville, Iowa, and Professor McKee's academy. Took courses in bookkeeping and accounting. Was formerly a farmer and shipped live stock. Is now secretary and manager of Wahoo mutual loan and building association. Was a member of city council four years, city treasurer three years, county treasurer four years, county assessor four years, chairman of board of equalization four years and state senator in 1927, 1929, 1931 and 1933. Is a Presbyterian. Belongs to I. O. O. F. lodge and Rebekah lodge, and Modern Woodmen. Address: Wahoo.

THOMAS GASS (Democrat). Twenty-fifth district. Born at Harvey, New Brunswick, August 26, 1864. Settled in Nebraska in the spring of 1873. Married on December 25, 1894, to Gertrude I. Tracy; one child. Ancestors came to America from Scotland in 1849. Attended common schools. Is a retired farmer and banker. Formerly engaged in the hardware business and as a contractor. Is a member of the Elks and the chamber of commerce. Was a member of the senate in 1933. Address: Kearney.

CHARLES D. GREEN (Democrat). Thirty-first district. Born in Kearney, Nebraska, February 23, 1881. Married Grace O. Lipska; three children. Attended common school and University of Nebraska. Formerly was a printer and editor. Is now a farmer. Is a member of the Methodist church. Served as a senator in 1933. Address: Sidney.

PAUL FRANCIS HALPINE (Democrat). Fifth district. Born, June 6, 1906, in Omaha. Married Jeanie Dean Lauer, June 4, 1932; one child. Ancestors French and Irish. Came to this country in 1830. Attended Central high school in Omaha and Creighton university. Is in the insurance business. Is second lieutenant in the Army reserve corps and president of the Omaha tennis club. Was a member of the senate in 1933. Is a member of the Catholic church. Address: Omaha.

FREDERICK G. HAWXBY (Democrat). First district. Born December 10, 1871, at Nemaha, Nebraska. Married Pearle N. Norton, November 17, 1909. There are two children. Ancestors came from England in 1856. Attended Western normal, Lincoln normal and the University of Nebraska where he received his B.A. in 1899 and LL.B. in 1901. Has been a teacher; is now an attorney at law. Was superintendent of the Britton, So. Dak., schools for two years; county attorney, Nemaha county for four years; county judge, 1916 to 1920; secretary of the council of defense and chairman of the four minute men during the war. Was a member of the house of representatives in 1929 and a senator in 1933. Was a member of the Union society at the university and is a Mason. Is a member of the Christian church. Address: Auburn.

HARRY LEIGHTON KUNKEL (Democrat). Twenty-first district. Born at Shippenburg, Cumberland county, Pennsylvania, July 8, 1866. Ancestors came from

Holland. Came to Nebraska in 1877. Attended public schools. Married Edith Mae McNeal, June 19, 1912; four children. Is a farmer and live stock breeder. Has been president of Boone county fair, treasurer of his school district, and president of Boone county farmers' mutual insurance company. Was state senator in 1931 and 1933. Is a member of the Congregational church. Belongs to the Odd Fellows, Knights of Pythias, and Kiwanis club. Address: Albion.

FRANK MONROE McCARTER (Democrat). Thirty-second district. Born in Lexington, Nebraska, June 22, 1882. Married J. W. Smith, May 1, 1912. Has five children. Ancestors came from Scotland and Ireland two generations ago. Was graduated from Bayard high school and took special work at Nebraska Wesleyan and Kearney normal. Has been a farmer and stock raiser. Is now engaged as a contractor. Was president pro-tem of senate in 1933. Is a thirty-second degree Mason, a member of the Odd Fellows, Lions club, Yellow Dogs, associated chamber of commerce and a member of the Methodist church. Address: Bayard.

FRANCIS EUGENE McCORMICK (Democrat). Twenty-fourth district. Born in Manchester, Iowa, July 14, 1884. Settled in Nebraska in 1900. Married Mildred Stark, June 4, 1914; seven children. Father is Irish and English, migrating to America in 1849. His mother's ancestors were Scotch, Irish, Welsh and Dutch. She was a descendant of the Stewart and Smiley families. Attended school up to the eighth grade. At present is in the general merchandising business; has been connected with the real estate business and farming. Has been chairman of the village board for three years and member of the school board for thirteen. Was a member of the Nebraska senate in 1933. Is a thirty-second degree Mason and a member of I. O. O. F. Address: Wolbach.

JAMES PATRICK MURRAY (Democrat). Twenty-third district. Born in Adrian, Michigan, he settled in Nebraska in 1887. Both parents were born in Ireland; father came to America in 1867 and mother in 1869. Was educated in the common schools. Formerly was a farmer and stockman; at the present is an auctioneer and salesman. Has served as precinct assessor for four years. Was a member of the 134th U. S. infantry in the world war. Is a Catholic and a member of the American legion and the Knights of Columbus. Was a senator in 1933. Address: Sargent.

FRED A. NEELAND (Democrat). Thirty-second district. Born in Missouri, December 2, 1874, and removed to Nebraska in 1888. Married Agnes F. Esancy in 1902; three children. Ancestors were Irish. Was graduated from Chadron academy. Is a farmer, ranchman and breeder of registered Hereford cattle. Has been treasurer of Dawes county, a school district officer, chairman of the Dawes county farm bureau and Chadron Hereford breeders' association. Is a Methodist and vice-president of the American Sunday school union. Was a senator in 1933. Address: Hemingford.

E. M. NEUBAUER (Democrat). Twenty-eighth district. Representative in 1925, 1927 and 1929; and a state senator in 1931 and 1933. Born at Oxford, Nebraska, in 1885. His father came to America from Germany at age of sixteen. His mother also of German descent. Educated in the public schools and Hastings college. Married November 22, 1906, to Annetta Davis; has two children. Has been employed in the hardware business. Is at present a farmer and stock raiser. Is a member of the school board. Has been township clerk, president of Farmers' elevator for five years, secretary-treasurer of Farmers' butter factory for three years. Is a Presbyterian. Member of the Modern Woodmen. Address: Orleans.

ARTHUR L. NEUMANN (Democrat). Ninth district. Born at Andover, Illinois, February 3, 1870. Came to Nebraska in 1881. Unmarried. Father came from Germany in 1857 and mother from Sweden in 1849. Attended Oakland, Nebraska, schools. Has been a banker since 1892; was formerly a clerk. State senator in 1927, 1929, 1931 and 1933. Belongs to Masons, Elks and Odd Fellows. Address: Oakland.

JOSEPH P. O'FUREY (Democrat). Born in Wheatland, Pennsylvania, June 1, 1876, of Irish ancestry. Married Lula Mae Price, July 6, 1904. One daughter only surviving child. Came to Nebraska, October 1, 1915, to become publisher of the Cedar

County News, Hartington, following nearly twenty years of connection with papers at Cleveland, Cincinnati, Youngstown, Ohio, and Sioux City, Iowa. Served nine years as a member of the Board of Directors of the Nebraska Press association, being president of the association in 1923. Has served as vice-president for Nebraska of the National Editorial association and is now serving his fourteenth year as secretary-treasurer of the Northeast Nebraska Editorial association. Was also the founder and first president of the Inter-State Press association. Has served as president of the Hartington chamber of commerce and as a member of the board of education. Is a member of Sigma Delta Chi, national honorary journalistic fraternity and is an adopted member of the Santee Sioux Indians. Was active in the organized labor movement during his residence as a young man at Cleveland, Ohio, being a follower of the famous Tom L. Johnson. Was a delegate to the democratic national convention in 1924 from the Third Nebraska district, being secretary of the Nebraska delegation. His hobby is the development of the talents of young people. Was state senator in 1933 from the tenth district. Address: Hartington.

HENRY PEDERSEN (Democrat). Twenty-seventh district. Native Nebraskan. Born at Hardy, January 2, 1893. Parents came from Denmark. Attended Nuckolls county schools, and Nebraska State Agricultural College. Married Doris May Sims, February 24, 1915; four children. Is a farmer and stockman. Was a director of school and church boards and district farmers' union. Is president of the Farmers' Union local organization, director of Farmers' Union co-operative creameries of Nebraska, executive director of Webster county Farm Bureau, and director of Guide Rock state bank. Was state senator in 1931 and 1933. Is a member of the Lutheran church, and the following fraternal orders: Rebekah, I. O. O. F., Patriarchal Encampment, Samaritan, and Masons. Address: Guide Rock.

PETER ROALD PETERSON (Democrat). Thirtieth district. Born January 17, 1881, in Copenhagen, Denmark. Settled in Nebraska, March, 1884. Married Elizabeth Beatty, March 25, 1908. Has three children. Attended Lexington high school and Grand Island business college. Studied law privately. Formerly was a paper maker and grain dealer. At present is a farmer. For nine years was a school board director; road supervisor, six years; and Democratic county committeeman for fifteen years. Was state senator in 1933. Is a Methodist. Address: Lexington.

WATSON L. PURDY (Democrat). Eleventh district. Born February 18, 1872, at Marietta, Washington county, Ohio. Ancestors were English, coming to this country in 1721. Settled in Nebraska in 1886. On August 28, 1894, married Mary Frances Bryant; six children, four sons and two daughters. Educated in the public schools. Is a farmer. Served as county commissioner of Madison county for seven years, from 1912 to 1919. Served in the Legislature; in the house of representatives 1 term, in 1919, and in the senate 1 term, in 1933. Address: Madison.

SAMUEL J. ROTHWELL (Democrat). Seventh district. Born on April 25, 1853, in Potters Hill, Rhode Island. Settled in Nebraska in 1878. Married Elizabeth C. Worrell in 1898. He has four children. Father is of English ancestry and mother of Scotch-Irish descent. Came to America in 1833. Attended high school in Ashaway, Rhode Island. For thirty years was a rancher. Is now retired. Was a member of the Nebraska senate in 1933. Address: Omaha.

HUGO E. SANDEN (Democrat). Sixth district. Born in Marshal county, Kansas, on September 25, 1879. Settled in Nebraska in 1914. Married Dora Clark, October 24, 1909. His father came from Sweden in 1865 and his mother in 1868 also from Sweden. Had a common school education. Retired at present. Formerly traveling salesman and in finance business. Co-author of "Un-Tax-It, the Challenge to Communistic Americanism." Was senator in 1933. Address: Omaha.

HUGO F. SRB (Democrat). Eighth district. Native Nebraskan. Born in Dodge, Nebraska. Father came from Bohemia in 1876; mother in 1890. Attended public schools of Dodge, Wayne State Normal School, and the Law College of the University of Nebraska. Married Frances Grace Davey, June 16, 1926; three children. Is a practicing lawyer. Has taught school. Was state senator in 1931 and 1933. Is a

member of the board of education, Congregational church, the American legion, and Phi Alpha Delta (college fraternity). Address: Dodge.

CLOYD L. STEWART (Democrat). Twenty-sixth district. Born in Hill City, Kansas, on August 22, 1891, and settled in Nebraska in 1905. Married Miss Wunenberg, June 10, 1926; two children. Ancestors came from Scotland. Attended Kearney military academy and University of Nebraska law college. Has been county attorney of Clay county for ten years and in private practice for seven. Has been city attorney in Clay Center and a member of the school board. Is a thirty-second degree Mason, a member of the Knights of Pythias and the Congregational church. Was a state senator in 1933. Address: Clay Center.

ROLLA C. VAN KIRK (Republican). Fourteenth district. Representative in 1927 and 1929; state senator in 1931 and 1933. Born February 13, 1894, at Neligh, Nebraska. Married December 27, 1924, to Lenore Burkett; one child. Ancestors came from Holland. Attended Neligh high school, Yankton college and University of Nebraska. Is a lawyer. Has been a teacher, postal clerk and soldier. Is a Methodist. Belongs to Alpha Sigma Phi, Phi Alpha Delta, A. F. & A. M., B. P. O. E., and American legion. Address: Lincoln.

CHARLES JOSEPH WARNER (Republican). Fifteenth district. Representative in 1901, 1903, 1905, and state senator in 1919, 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927, 1929, 1931 and 1933. Born in Lancaster county, Nebraska, 1875, of Swedish ancestry. Attended Lutheran academy in 1891-1892, Lincoln normal university, 1894, and graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1899, and from the Columbian law school, Washington, D. C., 1902. Mr. Warner is a progressive farmer and president of the Lancaster farmers' state bank. Is a member of the Congregational church; Masons (Scottish Rite, Knights Templar), and Modern Woodmen. Address: Waverly.

ANDY J. WELCH (Democrat). Eighteenth district. Born at Milford, Nebraska, in 1875. Married January 1, 1896, to Mary Birky; two children. Attended public school. Is a merchant and farmer. Served four terms on village board and six terms on school board. State senator in 1929, 1931 and 1933. Belongs to Methodist church and M. W. A. Address: Milford.

JOSEPH G. ADAMS (Democrat). Nineteenth district. Born in Omaha, October 29, 1893. Ancestors migrated to America from England in 1890. Attended high school in Omaha. A member of the house of representatives in 1933. Belongs to the Congregational church and is a member of A. F. & A. M., Capitol lodge No. 3. Address: Omaha.

MERLAN E. ADAMS (Democrat). Ninety-seventh district. Born on June 19, 1882, at Gilmore, Nebraska. Married Edna Fern Moore on March 29, 1905. Has three girls and one boy. Received his education in the common schools. Is a farmer. Was a member of the house of representatives in 1933. Is a Protestant. Address: Scottsbluff.

ANTON MARINUS ANDERSON (Democrat). Fifty-sixth district. Representative in 1927, 1931 and 1933. Born at N. Kongesler, Denmark, July 1, 1872. Came to Nebraska in 1889. Married Gertrude Jespersen, October 24, 1900. Five children. Attended common schools and Grand Island business college. Is a farmer. Has been a member of the school board, and justice of the peace, road overseer, official of Farmers' union for many years, secretary of Nuckolls county anti-thief association. Is a member of Lutheran church. Address: Oak.

EMIL ANDERSON (Democrat). Seventy-third district. Representative in 1925, 1931 and 1933. Born in Sweden, September 14, 1868. Came to America with his parents in 1869. Settled in Nebraska in June, 1877. Was educated in the public schools. Married Miss Selma Anderson, April 19, 1913. Is a retired farmer. Is a director of the Farmers' elevator and of the First national bank. Is president of the Kearney county co-operative creamery. Is a member of the Lutheran church. Address: Minden.

B. F. BALDER (Democrat). Thirtieth district. Born at Ashland, Nebraska, on December 30, 1834. Ancestors were Germans. Attended Ashland public schools and Boyles commercial college at Omaha. Married Elvera M. Reifert, on October 8, 1916. Is a grocer. Belongs to the A. F. & A. M. and the Royal Highlanders. Held office on Ashland city council and was also city treasurer. Address: Ashland.

FRED H. BARCLAY (Democrat). Second district. Born in Aurora, Illinois, September 14, 1879, and settled in Nebraska in May, 1883. Married Nellie M. Colwell, April 26, 1905; three sons and two daughters. Ancestors came from Scotland about 1856. Attended country school. Has been in the clothing business since 1899. Formerly lived on a farm. Has been a member of board of Federation of Nebraska Retailers, four years; president of Nebraska Retail Clothiers' Association, three years, and national director from Nebraska in the same association.
