

LEGISLATURE OF 1935-1937

SENATORS

CHARLES E. ALLEN (Republican). Thirtieth district. Senator in 1923, 1931 and 1935. Born at Russell, Iowa, January 8, 1865. Came to Nebraska in 1886. Married Susan L. Morrow, August 29, 1899; six children. Mrs. Allen died July 15, 1919. Married Katherine F. Worley, June 14, 1925. Ancestry Scotch and Dutch. Was educated in the public schools. Is a retired merchant and banker. Address: Cozad.

ALVIN BLESSING (Republican). Twenty-third district. Member of senate in 1935. Born in Michigan in 1871. Came to Nebraska in 1880. Married Clenemie Hull, December 25, 1893; three children. Attended grade schools. Raised live-stock. Had been city clerk, county clerk, member of county board, and county assessor. Was a member of the Presbyterian church, the A. F. & A. M. and Knights of Pythias lodges. Deceased, January 26, 1936.

FRANK J. BRADY (Republican). Twenty-second district. Member of senate in 1935. Born at Atkinson, September 15, 1894. Married Miss Olson, July 12, 1930; one child. Attended public schools and the university of Nebraska. Is a rancher and coal and grain dealer. Has been member of city council, president of the Nebraska division of the Izaak Walton League. Is a Methodist. Is a member of Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity and A. F. & A. M. lodge (Scottish Rite). Address: Atkinson.

EMIL E. BRODECKY (Democrat). Twelfth district. Born in Schuyler, June 26, 1885. Married October 14, 1908, to Lucy M. Novak; three boys. Father came in 1873 and mother in 1871 from Czechoslovakia. Was graduated from Howells high school in 1904 and the University school of agriculture in 1907. Is engaged in farming and dairying. Served as a member of the state militia for three years, on the board of education three terms, and as secretary-treasurer of Farmers' lumber and grain company at Howells for seventeen years. Member of Z. C. B. J. and of Howells band. Was a state senator in 1933 and 1935. Is a member of St. John's church. Address: Howells.

WILLIAM C. BULLARD (Democrat). Twenty-ninth district. Born in Omaha, May 28, 1899. Married Edith Bacon, December 31, 1919; two boys. Attended high school and grades in Omaha. Formerly was engaged in the wholesale plumbing and heating business in Omaha. Now is a lumber dealer. Is president of McCook Chamber of Commerce. Belongs to Episcopal church and B. P. O. E. Was a member of the senate in 1933 and 1935. Address: McCook.

PEARL LEROY CADY (Democrat). Eighth district. Member of senate in 1935. Born at Bellwood, August 1, 1883. Married Miss Larson, September 17, 1910; three children. English ancestry. Attended Columbus high school, Fremont normal, Veterinary college, Kansas City, Missouri. Has taught school. Is a practicing veterinarian. Has been mayor of village, president of fair board and president of state veterinary medical association. Is a member of Congregational church and A. F. & A. M. lodge (Knight Templar, Shriner). Address: Arlington.

JOHN S. CALLAN (Democrat). Sixteenth district. Was born in Odell, Nebraska, April 20, 1890. Married Agnes Armstrong, June 18, 1919; two boys. Ancestors came from Scotland and Germany. Was graduated from Odell high school. Attended University of Nebraska two years. Was postmaster at Odell for nine years. Present occupation—hardware, implement and automobile dealer. Has been treasurer of a district school, a member of the city council, and a state senator in 1933 and 1935. Served over-seas thirteen months. Is a Mason and a member of the American legion. Address: Odell.

FRED L. CARSTEN (Democrat). Second district. Member of senate in 1935. Born at Avoca, November 25, 1886. Married Nancy Ethel Fleshman, May 3, 1911; one child. His mother came from Alsace Lorraine in 1874. Attended Iowa Wesleyan University, Lincoln Business College and Nebraska Agricultural College. Is a farmer. Has served as precinct assessor. Is a member of Congregational church, A. F. & A. M., and I. O. O. F. lodges. Address: Avoca.

CLOYD E. CLARK (Republican). Twenty-eighth district. Member of senate, special session, October, 1935. Born at McCook, August 7, 1901. Attended McCook high school and University of Nebraska. Received LL.B. degree in 1925. Is an attorney. Has been village treasurer. Is a Methodist. Is a member of Delta Chi and Phi Alpha Delta fraternities, and Masonic and Elks lodges. Address: Elwood.

CHARLES B. CROWLEY (Democrat). Fifth district. Member of senate in 1935. Born at Omaha, November 28, 1906. Married Miss Hastings, June 6, 1931. Received LL.B. degree from Creighton University. Is an attorney. Is member of Catholic church. Address: Omaha.

CHARLES A. DAFOE (Democrat). First district. Member of the senate in 1935. Was born at Tecumseh, September 22, 1901. Married Miss Findley, June 26, 1924. Ancestors were Dutch and German. Received A.B. degree from Nebraska Wesleyan University and LL.B. degree from University of Nebraska. Was city attorney four years and county attorney, Johnson county, eight years. Is a Methodist. Belongs to Theta Phi Sigma, Phi Alpha Delta, A. F. and A. M. and Knights of Pythias. Address: Tecumseh.

EDWARD GILLETTE (Republican). Twenty-eighth district. Member of senate in 1935. Born at San Diego, California, October 26, 1895. Came to Nebraska in 1904. Ancestry French and Irish. Married Miss Hildreth, October 23, 1923; one child. Attended Holdrege high school and University of Nebraska. Is a farmer and dairyman. Is a member of Presbyterian church. Belongs to Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity, the American Legion and the National Guard. Address: Holdrege.

CHARLES D. GREEN (Democrat). Thirty-first district. Born in Kearney, February 23, 1881. Married Grace O. Lipska; three children. Attended common school and University of Nebraska. Formerly was printer and editor. Is now a farmer. Is a member of Methodist church. Served as member of senate 1933 and 1935. Address: Sidney.

LELAND HALL (Democrat). Twenty-sixth district. Member of senate, special session, October, 1935. Born at Elkhorn, May 6, 1894. Married Hazel A. Parks, June 23, 1920; two children. Attended Roseland high school and Hastings College. Received A.B. degree in 1915. Is a banker. Was village clerk seventeen years, member of school board nine years and member of Democratic state central committee. Is a Methodist. Belongs to Masonic and Knights of Pythias lodges. Address: Roseland.

LEON L. HINES (Democrat). Twenty-ninth district. Member of senate, special session, October, 1935. Born at Imperial, September 25, 1891. Married Keturah E. Sipe, June 20, 1917; one child. Ancestors came from Germany. Attended McCook high school and University of Nebraska. Is an attorney. Was county attorney, Dundy county, 1926-30. ALBERT T. HOWARD (Republican). Thirty-third district. Member of senate in 1935. Born at Weeping Water, April 6, 1893. Married N. Antha Taylor, June 20, 1919; one child. Ancestry Scotch-Irish. Is a graduate of Scottsbluff high school. Is a florist. Has been grain and livestock dealer, wholesale oil salesman, sugar chemist and assistant postmaster. Was mayor of Scottsbluff, 1931-35. JOSEPH F. KASPAR (Democrat). Thirteenth district. Member of senate in 1935. Resigned May 13, 1935. He is married and has five children. Has practiced medicine for thirty years. Address: Prague.

HOMER D. LEGGETT (Republican). Twenty-third district. Member of senate, special session, October 1935. Born in Michigan, July 17, 1871. Came to Nebraska in 1895. Married Miss Clements, October 11, 1898; two children. Attended public schools of Lisbon, Michigan, and graduated from business college at Battle Creek, Michigan. Has been a hardware dealer. Is in publishing business. Has been city clerk. Is a Unitarian, a member of I. O. O. F., and Royal Highlanders. Address: Ord.

NELSON JAMES LUDI (Democrat). Thirteenth district. Member of senate, 1935. Born at Rock Island, Illinois, February 26, 1855. Came to Nebraska in 1885. Married Lillian Mary Easton, June 26, 1879; eight children. Ancestors were from Switzerland. Attended public schools at Davenport, Iowa. Has been practicing attorney. Is an editor. Has been member of county board, postmaster, state printer. Is a Presbyterian and member of A. F. & A. M. lodge. (Scottish Rite). Address: Wahoo.

J. C. MCGOWAN (Republican). Eleventh district. Senator in 1921, 1923, 1925, 1927, 1929, 1931 and 1935. Born at Centralia, Missouri, February 19, 1869. Came to Nebraska in 1884. Father came from Ireland in 1845. Married Miss Harbert in 1896; two children. Attended common schools and University of Missouri. Was a machinist; formerly a teacher. Was member of Christian church, I. O. O. F., Sons of Veterans, Machinists Union, Woodmen of the World, Ancient Order of United Workmen, and Benefit association of railway employees. Deceased November 19, 1935.

JOHN J. McMAHON (Democrat). Seventh district. Member of senate, 1935. Born March 14, 1881. Came to Nebraska in 1916. Married Miss Triplett, February 22, 1917. Attended public schools and high school at Pekin, Illinois. Is a boilermaker. Is secretary of Boilermakers and Central Labor Union. Is member of State advisory committee of FERA and of city planning board of Omaha. Is a Catholic. Address: Omaha.

IVAN H. MATTSON (Democrat). Twenty-fifth district. Member of senate, 1935. Was born at Göteborg, Sweden, January 7, 1895. Came to Nebraska in 1905. Married Miss Olsson, August 21, 1929. Attended Kearney public schools and Kearney State Teachers College. Is a photographer. Member of Kearney city council for eight years. Is a Lutheran and member of Kearney drama league. Address: Kearney.

GEORGE H. MERTEN (Democrat). Seventh district. Member of senate, special session, October, 1935. Born at St. Louis, Missouri, September 15, 1879. Came to Nebraska in 1880. Married Alice McCauley in 1908; one child. German ancestry. Is graduate of Grafton high school and received A.B. and LL.B. degrees from Creighton University. Is an attorney. Is member of Catholic church. Address: Omaha.

FRED A. NEELAND (Democrat). Thirty-second district. Born in Missouri, December 2, 1874, and removed to Nebraska in 1888. Married Agnes F. Esancy in 1902; three children. Ancestors were Irish. Was graduated from Chadron academy. Is a farmer, ranchman and breeder of registered Hereford cattle. Has been treasurer of Dawes county, a school district officer, chairman of the Dawes county farm bureau and Chadron Hereford breeders' association. Is a Methodist and vice-president of the American Sunday school union. Was a senator in 1933 and 1935. Address: Hemingford.

ARTHUR L. NEUMANN (Democrat). Ninth district. Born at Andover, Illinois, February 3, 1870. Came to Nebraska in 1881. Unmarried. Father came from Germany in 1857 and mother from Sweden in 1849. Attended Oakland, Nebraska, schools. Has been a banker since 1892; was formerly a clerk. Leader of town band 45 years. State senator in 1927, 1929, 1931, 1933 and 1935. Belongs to Masons, Elks and Odd Fellows. Address: Oakland.

ARCHIE C. O'BRIEN (Democrat). Twenty-fourth district. Born at Green River, Wyoming, May 26, 1902. Came to Nebraska in 1910. Married Miss Bydalek, June 17, 1930. Ancestry Irish. Attended Wood River high school, Grand Island Business Col-

lege and Creighton University. Is a lawyer and a farmer. Is a member of the Catholic church. Address: Grand Island.

HENRY PEDERSEN (Democrat). Twenty-seventh district. Born at Hardy, January 2, 1893. Parents came from Denmark. Attended Nuckolls county schools and Nebraska State Agricultural College. Married Doris May Sims, February 24, 1915; five children. Is a farmer and stockman. Was a director of school and church boards and district farmers' union. Is president of the Farmers' Union local organization, director of Farmers' Union co-operative creameries of Nebraska, executive director of Webster county Farm Bureau, and director of Guide Rock state bank. Came to Nebraska in 1871. Married Agnes Keating, January 14, 1920. Ancestry Irish; mother came to the U. S. in 1841, father in 1851. Is a member of the Catholic church, Knights of Columbus, Elks, T. JOHN D. REYNOLDS (Republican). Tenth district. Member of senate in 1935. Born in Vermont, June 10, 1870. Came to Nebraska in 1900. Married Annie Ortmann, November 30, 1899; nine children. Ancestry Scotch-Irish. Educated in public schools. Is a farmer. Has been in mercantile business and was police officer. Served as director of school district for twelve years. Has been member of the State board of the farmers' union of Nebraska for ten years, director of Farmers' union credit corporation and the Farmers' union live-stock commission of Sioux City. Address: Niobrara.

OSCAR EDWIN SCHULTZ (Democrat). Twenty-first district. Member of senate in 1935. Born at Elgin, October 31, 1898. Married Merle Farris, October 4, 1928. Attended Elgin public schools. Is a farmer. Is a member of the board of directors of Antelope county fair. Is a Presbyterian, a member of A. F. & A. M. lodge and Elgin Commercial club. Address: Elgin.

CLOYD L. STEWART (Democrat). Twenty-sixth district. Born in Hill City, Kansas, August 22, 1891. Settled in Nebraska in 1905. Married Marie Wunenberg, June 10, 1926; three children. Ancestry Scotch.
