EXECUTIVE ORDER

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Nebraska it is ordered as follows:

SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION. (a). There is hereby established the GOVERNOR'S COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE (hereafter referred to as the Commission).

(b). The Commission shall consist of such members as the Governor shall appoint, one of whom shall be designated by the Governor as the chairman. The members and chairman of the Commission shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

(c). For purposes of administration, the Commission will be attached to the Department of Public Institutions.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE OF COMMISSION. The purpose of the Commission is to do all things which it may determine to be relevant to control crime and achieve fair and effective law enforcement. Pursuant to this end, the Commission shall direct its efforts toward the following basic elements of the criminal justice system: (1) substantive criminal laws, (2) law enforcement agencies, (3) courts and court procedures, and (4) correctional agencies and institutions.

SECTION 3. FUNCTIONS OF COMMISSION. The Commission shall:

(1) Make or encourage studies of any aspect of the administration of criminal justice;

(2) Conduct research and stimulate research by public and private agencies which shall be designed to improve the administration of criminal justice;

(3) Develop a comprehensive plan, with priorities, for the improvement of the administration of criminal justice and promote its implementation;

(4) Co-ordinate activities relating to the administration of criminal justice among agencies of the state and local agencies;

(5) Co-operate with the federal and other state and local authorities concerning the administration of criminal justice;

(6) Educate the community at large to the problems encountered by the police and other law enforcement authorities, promote respect for law and encourage community involvement in the administration of criminal justice;

(7) Appoint such advisory committees as may be necessary, convenient or desirable to the effectuation of the purpose and functions of the commission; and

(8) Do all things necessary, convenient or desirable to carry out its purpose and for the exercise of the functions delineated in this order.

SECTION 5. COMPENSATION OF COMMISSION. The members of the Commission shall serve without compensation, but they shall be entitled to receive reimbursement for any actual expenses incurred as a necessary incident to such service.

SECTION 6. REPORTS. The commission shall report annually to the Governor on its activities and may make such other reports as it deems appropriate.
