EXECUTIVE ORDER 94-2

WHEREAS, LB 545, passed by the Nebraska Legislature and approved by the Governor on May 4, 1993 empowers the Governor to accept on behalf of the State of Nebraska, retrocession of Federal Jurisdiction if offered by the appropriate Federal authority;

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Public Building Amendments of 1988 (Public Law 100-678), 102 Stat. 4050, gives General Services Administration (GSA) the authority to offer an assignment of jurisdiction for the administration of criminal, health and safety laws for property under their charge and control;

WHEREAS, on August 19, 1993, GSA offered assignment of jurisdiction to the State of Nebraska for the administration of Nebraska criminal laws and health and safety laws; provided that such jurisdiction is to be concurrent with jurisdiction of the United States who will continue to administer Federal laws;

WHEREAS, the offer of assignment and concurrent jurisdiction pertains to the following Federal properties:

Vehicle Storage Area, 17th & Jackson, Omaha, NE0035ZZ

Post Office and Courthouse, 203 West 2nd, Grand Island, NE NE0018ZZ

Federal Office Building, 106 South 15th, Omaha, NE0032ZZ

NOW, THEREFORE, I, E. Benjamin Nelson, Governor of the State of Nebraska, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Nebraska, do accept the offer of assignment of concurrent jurisdiction.

This Executive Order shall become effective immediately upon its execution.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State of Nebraska to be affixed this 13th day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ninety-four.
